This endorsement extends to protect your club and its members for bodily injury arising out of the rendering of or failure to render professional services by a physician, dentist or nurse while employed or sponsored by your club.

If your members are performing this test and they are not a trained medical professional, our policy should respond to protect them and your club from liability arising out of this activity subject to the policy provisions.
